

LETTER FROM THE MINISTER

One last offering from Rev Verity Phillips as she moves to the West Midlands

Dear Friends

Already this is my final letter. Where did those few months go? In delight and joy and wonder ...

As I look to taking up a new station in September, I find myself reflecting deeply on what it means to be a Christian leader. We look to leaders to guide us, and perhaps to put things in place which make it possible for us to do what we want. It can be tempting to raise them high above the ground, making it hard for them to function for fear of falling. At other times it's tempting to expect them to do everything for us, so we can relax. Neither extreme is ideal. Human leaders are human.

The kind of leadership Jesus showed was thoughtful, slow to speak, and unafraid. But it was always kind and inclusive, lifting the vulnerable, welcoming the unexpected, washing tired feet. The challenges were reserved mainly for the powerful and those who thought they knew best.

Every single person is a leader some of the time. They may be the leader at work, or in the family, or at an interest group, or among a group of friends. They may be a leader without knowing it to those who notice how they treat other people. It may not be until our obituary that the full picture of how our life has led others will emerge. How we lead says a lot about who we really are.

What kind of leader do we hope for? The servant who encourages others to shine, or the Mediaeval king, divinely appointed to the throne? The indulgently gracious and forgiving welcomer, or s/he who must be obeyed? The one I follow was a wounded healer, who entered our brokenness and changed everything within for the better. Who do you follow? How then will you lead?

WHAT IS A GIFT DAY?

The Mission Group are planning a Reminiscing Day for September, and part of what will happen that day is that we will hold a Gift Day. We haven't held a Gift Day in many years, so what is a 'Gift Day'?

We need to raise a very large sum of money: over a hundred thousand pounds, and are actively making grant applications. A Gift Day is when we ask for public donations towards that amount which are usually far more substantial than the normal offering. The level of giving will show just how much your church means to you, and will help us raise more grants when it is realised just how committed we are to our Church.

First of all, we will be receiving donations via a card reader for the first time, so I need to update my knowledge Gift Aid-wise and am signed up for a course via Zoom in July.

Secondly, we need to get special Gift Day envelopes printed with the church name on, including a Gift Aid declaration, so we are waiting to ascertain the cost for that. You can also write your name and address on them if able to Gift Aid. For every hundred pounds donated, we get an extra twenty-five pounds back from Inland Revenue. **BUT.** and it is a big **BUT**, you have to have paid enough tax to do that. It will depend on how much tax you pay. If you Gift Aid and did not pay enough tax then the Tax Office will want you to pay back the shortfall. You can speak to Brenda or myself if you are nor sure about this.

Like your weekly offering some can only afford £5 per week, thankfully half the congregation give between £10 and £20 each. What you are able to donate for the Gift Day is simply up to you. Our personal financial situations are vastly different, so you need to decide that for yourselves. On that morning Alistair Lowe will be in the Vestry to receive your gifts. He is bound by the same confidentiality as I am.

I will be ordering more Gift Day envelopes than we need for ourselves, so can you all ask your friends and neighbours if they are able to donate a small sum to help us swell that total? Please pray about this and do your best.
